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1. About the College

Govt. Mohindra College, Patiala, is one of the oldest and prestigious institutions of higher learning in the Northern part of the country. Established as a princely college way back in the last quarter of nineteenth century, the college is a living testimony of rich legacy and earnest desire of H. H. Maharaja Mohinder Singh (1852-76) of Patiala to provide quality education to the people of this region. The College was founded with a noble aim to provide free education to the people as the region was educationally laggard and socially disadvantaged.

At the time of its inception in 1875, it was the only institution of its kind in a vast area stretching from Lahore to Delhi. His Excellency, The Earl of Northbrook, the then Viceroy of India laid the foundation stone of the college building on 30th March 1875. The building was completed in about nine years and serves as a mark of architectural beauty; a living monument of rare magnificence and breath-taking grandeur. His Excellency, Viceroy Lord Ripon performed the Opening Ceremony on 17th March, 1884. At that time the College was affiliated to the Calcutta University, later on moved under Panjab University before finally getting affiliated to Punjabi University, Patiala in the year 1962.

The College has emerged as a popular place for academic excellence since its inception. Visits by Sh. S. Radhakrishnan, former President of India; E.M. Forster, the world renowned English novelist and many such renowned personalities speaks highly about the popularity and stature of the College among academic luminaries of national and international repute.

The college has evolved and expanded with the passage of time in terms of academic streams it covered. The college in the initial years imparted education in Sanskrit, Persian, and Arabic and the teaching of English and Mathematics was commenced shortly afterwards. In 1880, intermediate classes were started. To commemorate the 50th year of the reign of Her Majesty, Queen Victoria, the college was upgraded to B.A. standard of Punjab University, Lahore in the year 1887. Post-graduation in Mathematics was started in 1912, in Philosophy in 1922 and in Punjabi in 1949.

The College has covered a long journey of about 150 years in a regal style bolstered by the untiring efforts of the teaching faculty and scintillating achievements of its alumni in all fields of human activity, be it Sports, Culture, Academics, Civil and Defence Services, Industry, Commerce, Business, Politics and so on and so forth.

In recognition of its contribution to higher education, the Govt. of India issued a commemorative Postage Stamp on Mohindra College on March 14, 1988. Later on the State Govt. adjudged the college as one of the four 'Model' colleges of the State. The College was awarded the A+ Grade by the

‘NAAC’ in April 2003 in the Cycle-I of NAAC and in the Cycle-II, the college was awarded with “A” Grade with a CGPA “3.86” by the ‘NAAC’ in February 2016, the highest score given to any college in the country. In the year 2006, the University Grants Commission was selected under prestigious ‘Colleges with Potential for Excellence’ scheme, a status which the College enjoyed until 2014. In 2009, the Department of Biotechnology of the Ministry of Science and Technology, Govt. of India, selected the college for financial assistance under its ‘Star College in Life Sciences Scheme’. The College has been selected for being a Community College under the Community College Scheme of the UGC.

The institution stands head and shoulders high amidst the seminaries of learning in North India and has become a symbol of hope and aspirations to scholars and educators devoted to the pursuit of education and to youngsters with dreams in their eyes to achieve greater heights in their academic endeavours.

2. What is Gender Audit?

Women in higher education participate in huge number in the capacity of a student and as part of workforce i.e. as a administrator, teacher, non-teaching staff and in various other roles. Higher education campuses shall serve as exemplary places in the society where they must feel among the equals and shall not face any difficulty in expressing their free will. For this higher education institutes shall undertake necessary measures to sensitize every stakeholder towards concerns of gender equity, gender discrimination and significance of empowering women. Gender Audit in this regard is an important instrument assessing the performance of the institute in terms of furthering the cause the gender equity and as a place free from any form of discriminatory practices.

As per NAAC, “Gender auditing is a process of assessing policies, practices and procedures in an organization that specially addresses the issues related to women. It aims to identify developmental dimensions of providing opportunities for women in the organization for their growth and also aspects hindering women's advancements in the organization”.

3. Constitution of Gender Audit Committee

A Gender Audit Committee was constituted on by S. Amarjit Singh to prepare a Gender Audit Report of the college. The committee consists of

Implementing the Sexual Harassment of Women at the Workplace Act




The State and employers bear equal responsibility to ensure the dignity of women as workers by securing safe workspaces for women.



What is Sexual Harassment?
It includes any or several of the following **unwelcome or unwanted acts**:

- Physical contact and advances
- Demand or request for sexual favours
- Showing pornography
- Any other unwelcome physical, verbal or non-verbal conduct of sexual nature.

This may become a condition for the progress or detriment to a woman's employment; or it may make the workplace **intimidating and hostile** towards women in general.

In the Organized Sector, the Employer Must:

- Ensure a safe working environment for women through awareness drives.
- Establish an Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) to address complaints of sexual harassment.
- Take action against wrongdoers who are found to have committed sexual harassment by the ICC.



What kind of Workplaces does the Law Cover?
The law covers all workplaces in the organized and the unorganized sector. It includes government and private offices, hospitals, universities, sports facilities, construction sites, and also residential homes to protect domestic workers. The law extends protection to women discharging work-related duties outside the office premises.



For the Unorganized Sector, or Organizations with less than 10 Workers:
The State Government must notify District Officers who:

- Appoint nodal officers at the taluka/ block/ tehsil/ ward/ municipality levels to receive complaints of sexual harassment.
- Appoint a Local Complaints Committee (LCC) to inquire into charges of sexual harassment at the workplace and recommend action for redressal.
- Take steps to spread awareness on the rights of women.

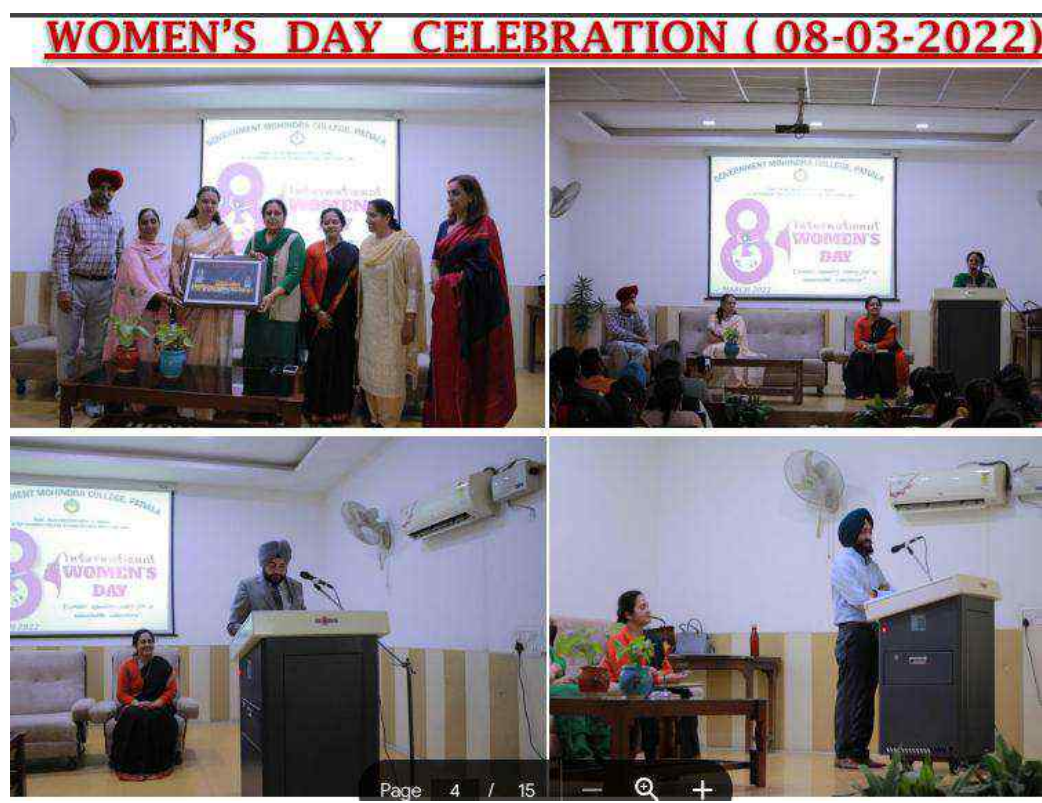

The governing bodies of the college have active participation from female faculty members. In almost all the committees, the percentage of women members is more than satisfactory.


The performance of the college in terms of raising women issues through various platforms and activities as part of its best practices is laudable.
